Rural Wisconsin Man Hypothesizes Unattractive Female Sibling

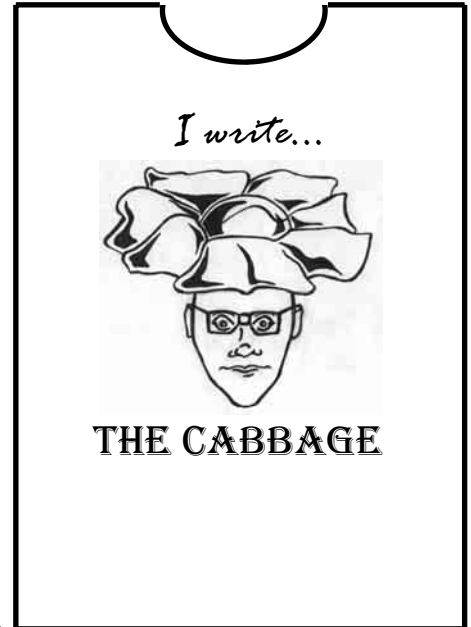

Richard Kimble Confesses to Homicide

“Fugitive” Star Claims Artistic License to Kill

BIRMINGHAM, AL—Richard Kimble, the well-known and oft-rooted-for fugitive from the law, confessed to the killing of his wife on Thursday during an emotional cross-examination by state prosecutors. The startling announcement is coming as a tremendous blow to the screen-addicted American public.

Already once convicted of murdering his wife, Dr. Richard Kimble escaped from a prison bus in Illinois and then went on a heart-warming personal crusade to find out why his wife was killed and who the real murderer was. Kimble was relentlessly pursued by the evil, Javert-esque Samuel Gerard, a U.S. Marshal dedicated to upholding the law. After almost four decades of searching for Kimble, an aging Gerard finally was able to apprehend the fugitive in January. The triumphant marshal was ecstatic. “Finally I feel like my law enforcement career is complete. Working on only one case for thirty-plus years has made my boss kinda angry, but in the end I got my man. I thought it would have been easier, though, because when I was at a loss I could see right where he (Kimble) was every week on CBS. How it ended was just weird, though. I can’t believe that he jumped out off that huge dam—that was just stupid,” said Gerard, referring to the end of the dramatic culvert showdown inside the Berkeley Dam. Thirty-two of Kimble’s bones were found broken when he was finally fished out of the river two miles from the point of take-off.

The case was quickly brought to trial, with

prosecutors expressing supreme confidence in their case. “Thirty years ago, all we had was a bunch of ‘O’ positive blood, some dark hair, and other circumstantial evidence linking Kimble to the heinous crime. With new DNA testing procedures, there is now indisputable evidence as to Kimble’s guilt—99.9995 percent correlation with Kimble is something that the jury will have a hard time avoiding,” said lead prosecutor Casey Miller.

Facing such a strong case, Kimble had few options. The only chance for the television star was to rely on his refined acting skills, playing to the sympathies of the jury. On Thursday Kimble took the stand, where he finally broke down and confessed during Miller’s tough cross-examination. “All right, it was me! Are you happy? Are you satisfied? So I killed my wife with a blunt object, and then tried to blame it on some disabled guy. So what? But then I entertain all of you for years with my ingenious escapades, and what thanks do I get? A jail sentence? Well, that’s just great! I hope you are all really bored every Friday night from now on,” said an emotional Kimble.

After changing Kimble’s plea to guilty by reason of artistic license, the defense turned over the case into the hands of the jury. After only two hours of deliberation, the jury handed over its verdict. “After reviewing portions of the ‘60s series, the full-length feature film, the recent, poorer episodes of *The Fugitive*, and the rest of the evidence, we, the jury, find the defendant

guilty of entertaining us, making us laugh and cry, and of murder in the first degree.” The courtroom immediately erupted with the thunderous sounds of one-armed men clapping.

One juror, when asked by *The Cabbage* what was going through her mind in sequestration, said, “For a guy who’s supposed to be, like, sixty-eight, he looks really, really good.” Another juror, Thomas Martins, was also impressed by Kimble’s appearance. “Back in the ‘60s, the cops were originally looking for a guy that was dark-haired and straight-laced-looking—a guy that looked amazingly like actor David Janssen. Then in 1993 the guy surfaces again, and now he apparently looks like an older version of Han Solo—you know, the guy in ‘Star Wars.’ And now when I see him in the courtroom, he looks exactly like that guy from ‘Wings.’ He sure is a master of disguise,” said Martins.

Kimble faces life imprisonment, the maximum sentence for first-degree murder. After sentencing he will be remanded to an Alabama state correctional institution. Some, however, are calling for leniency for Kimble. Screen Actor’s Guild (SAG) member and Appellate court judge Richard Stuben has a better idea. “How about we put him in prison where they have that HBO show, ‘Oz.’ There he can pay his debt to society, and we can see him develop his conspiracy theories as a common prisoner, with the added benefit of watching his lovable antics every week. It’d be like Prison MacGyver, or maybe we could call it ‘The Wizard of Oz,’” said Stuben. Sentencing hearings for Kimble begin next week.
